As the Clinical Director of all Tampa Crossroads, Inc. Residential and Non-residential treatment programs, I provide weekly qualified supervision to clinical staff and interns, facilitate treatment team meetings, coordinate and provide trainings for staff, ensure program compliance with DCF and DOC licensure and contractual standards, and provide substance abuse and mental health counseling services to a small number of clients (5 to 8) weekly. Program Development duties include identifying and securing funding to maintain and grow our existing treatment programs through writing of grants, developing partnerships with referral sources, and identification of needed treatment services (service gaps) within the community and developing new programs to meet those needs.

In addition to my duties as Program Director, I continued to maintain a clinical caseload of 10 outpatient substance abuse and mental health clients, facilitated the Tampa Crossroads Aftercare Program, performed assessment, group and individual counseling, case management, and advocacy to the courts.
