

**Assistant/Associate Professor

Applications are invited for a tenure track position at the rank of Assistant/Associate Professor in the Program in Research and Evaluation Methodology (REM). The successful candidate is expected to begin August, 2012. REM offers master's and doctoral degrees to students interested in statistics, psychometrics, education measurement and assessment, and evaluation, and provides service courses to the College and University.

Responsibilities include

- Conducting a program of research and scholarly publication in quantitative research and evaluation methodology.
- Securing external funding to support research and training agendas.
- Teaching item response theory, scale development, and on-campus and online introductory and intermediate courses in statistics and developing new courses in psychometrics.
- Supervising graduate student research and teaching.
- Providing consultation to faculty and students.
- Providing service to the university and profession.

Minimum requirements include a doctorate in quantitative research methods in education or quantitative research methods in a related field, awarded not later than date of appointment at UF. Experience on an interdisciplinary investigative team to develop competitive research proposals is desirable.

This is a nine month tenure track position open at the Assistant or Associate Professor rank. Salary is negotiable, competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience.

ABOUT THE COLLEGE.
