Glossary

<u>Academic Year</u> - The time period between Summer, Fall, and Spring semesters in that order.

Advanced Graduate (Level II) - A graduate student who has been formally admitted to a recognized Doctoral or Post-Master's degree program who has accumulated 36 or more semester credit hours toward his or her degree.

<u>Beginning Graduate</u> (Level I)- A graduate student who has been formally admitted to a graduate program, but has not accumulated 36 credit hours.

<u>Fundable Student Credit Hours (SCH)</u> - Student credit hours which the university receives funding from the state as measured from the three final Student Data Course File submissions to the Board of Governors. An example of non-fundable student credit hours is when an employee takes a course and the University pays the tuition.

<u>Level of Student</u> - The student's level of progress toward a degree. Freshmen and Sophomore students are categorized as Lower Level; Junior and Senior students are categorized as Upper Level; Graduate students are categorized as Graduate Level.

<u>Lower Division Student</u> - A student who has earned less than sixty semester credit hours.

<u>Upper Division Student</u>- A student who has earned 60 or more semester credit hours or has a Associate of Arts degree or is working toward an additional Baccalaureate degree.

<u>Total Student Credit Hours (SCH)</u> - Total student credit hours, regardless of fundability status as defined by the legislature.

<u>Full-Time-Equivalent (F.T.E.) Student</u> - The teaching of 40 credit hours at the undergraduate level or 32 credit hours at the graduate level for an academic year.
