

Executive Summary 2006-2007
Graduate Recruitment, Admissions and Petitions Committee
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This report is a summary of the activities of the Graduate Recruitment, Admissions and Petitions Committee for the 2006-2007 academic year.

Overall Summary

The committee met six times over the course of the Fall and Spring terms. The central focus was on the question of whether this committee's role and functions were redundant given College of Education's recruitment and admissions resources. See meeting minutes for further clarification of this issue.

Suggestion for Action

As graduate recruitment issues arise requiring shared faculty governance, create an ad-hoc committee with clearly defined charges. Individual departments, through graduate and admissions coordinators, could partner with the RRMA office on a task force with the goal of improving recruitment initiatives.

Status of GRAP Committee

Committee members agreed to put the GRAP committee on hiatus until it can be determined whether RRMA and graduate/admissions coordinator recruitment initiatives are effective. If proven effective, the GRAP committee could be dissolved. Until that time, no further GRAP meetings are planned.
