- Thanked everyone who attended President Ben Sasse visit at COE on Friday trying to engage with faculty
 - Thoughtful questions were much appreciated
- o Reminded us of the new budget for 23-24. Please note that 30% of budget is dependent on university level approval outside of COE
- o Provost search going on three finalists in the group
- We submitted 26 proposals for the strategic funding opportunities for the president office –
 don't know what the review panel is going to be 21st September we should know more
 about the process October 20th can resubmit your proposal if not funded, and can be
 tweaked for resubmission
- Budget for this current year is very favorable. However, moving forward there will be changes to the budget model. Currently, there are five different scenarios for what the budget could look like in coming academic years
- Raises some colleges are saying they are doing a one-time cash payment, other colleges are doing 1.5%, COE is trying to institute a 3% raise based on merit, market equity
 - Earliest raises would appear in paychecks by October 20th, 2023
- o Be prepared to work remotely on Wednesday, due to the storm
- Faculty asked about possible changes with the union and how that may affect the CBA (e.g., parental leave) possibility to address this with FPC
 - A desire to identify specific policies and content currently addressed in the CBA that would be addressed by individual units (such as COE) and/or the larger university
 - FPC leadership agreed to review the CBA and will report back on policies and/or content covered in the CBA currently that would be impacted if it no longer existed
