Approval of Agenda

Meeting called to order at 2:02 pm Motion to approve the agenda by Anthony Botelho. at 2:02 pm. Caitlin Gallingane seconded with consensus of the group. Agenda carries at 2:03pm. No abstentions or objections.

Approval of Prior Meeting Minutes (January 29, 2023)

Motion by Anthony B. to approve meeting minutes. Seconded by Chriss Redding and approved by consensus of the group. Minutes stand approved at 2:04pm. No abstentions or objections.

Guest Speaker - UF Faculty Senate Chair Danaya C. Wright

- Here to answer any questions you may have:
 - o Post tenure review, we wanted it to be effortless and as solid as possible. Now you only have to turn in your CV and you can provide a narrative if you want. Possibly 15-20 individuals needing to go through post tenure review process.
 - o Provost office pulled together from academic analytics, information about publications and research and they came up with a metric to identify exceeds, meets expectations etc. Based on the analytics, they created this for every single department at the university. They have given it to every department. Must notify the provost office within one week if you want to make changes to the model. There is a list of criteria and university criteria. Research you are in the top of your department, teaching has some university criteria. Will be a quick turn around process. Criteria is linked to bonuses (union is bargaining this piece/what each rating will be worth). The research

- criteria in my department, and in those that I have seen, tend to be lower than we would normally expect.
- o Shared governance, over the next 2-3 years there will be a significant amount of recommendations for program changes, departmental changes, departments being merged, new departments. Faculty Council Committees should be focused on issues that matter. Have your shared governance mechanisms in place and functional.
- o Administrative burdens, 40% of faculty time is spent on this. We should see some significant progress in this. We are making changes to UF GO to make it a quicker process and so faculty does not need to interact with it. We are making changes to P-cards, and changes to trainings (maximum of three trainings). Efforts to lessen burdens on faculty. Changes on job posting and on-boarding, reducing delays. Student issues with teaching and being dropped from courses and canvas if they do not pay tution on time. Hopefully you will see an instant decline on notifications.
 - Dr. Colon shared concern for the students being dropped from canvas shells and proposing a delay in that in order to lessen that burden.
- o Countries of concern, if you have any data, put it together and send to Dr. Wright. All data would be useful. Data that can show the impact of losing these students and faculty from countries of concern.
 - Dr. Angela Kohnen: Concerns of Doctoral students being taken on from countries of concern. Do not offer or make promises to any students that they could get funding down the line. We want to make sure first and we do not want to put them in a tough place without funding.
 - Students from China that are returning to their hometown for field training, is this an issue now? No. The data process is still the same agreement that the college has had in place.
 - Dean Good: How will the Radical practicality initiative be implemented? Not sure at the moment but there is a lot of talk around having an impact. 10 by 10 by 10, ten programs in the top ten, within ten years: programs that had plans that could potentially generate impact were funded from last year. Units should be thinking ahead on ways to advance and make the college of education the best, making the most impact.
