

A Doctoral Leadership Grant Opportunity

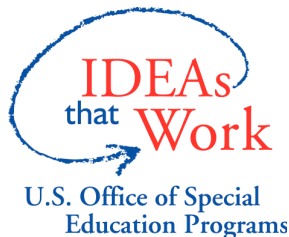
Project TIER: Teaching, Intervention, and Efficacy Research

The School of Special Education, School Psychology, and Early Childhood Studies in the College of Education at the University of Florida is pleased to announce an exciting new doctoral leadership preparation opportunity for individuals interested in obtaining a Ph.D. in Special Education and expertise in Reading, Behavior, and Research Methods.

Project TIER will include doctoral coursework in both evidence-based practices for students with disabilities and quantitative research methods. Students will also attend national conferences, participate in research workshops, and receive hands-on experience working on a variety of studies targeting behavioral and literacy needs of students with disabilities.

In addition to professional development, project participants will receive a **competitive support package** including:

Project TIER applications are currently being accepted. Admitted students will begin taking the program in Fall 2017.

To be eligible for Project TIER, students must meet the following requirements:

1. Be admitted into the special education PhD program,
2. Hold a master's degree in special education or a related field,
3. Enroll as a full-time graduate student,
4. Be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident, and
5. Adhere to the requirements established by the U.S. Department of Education and implemented by the Personnel Development Program Data collection Center (<https://pdp.ed.gov/osep>).
