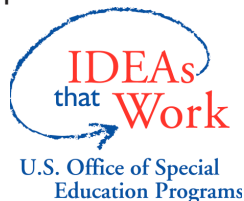


A Doctoral Leadership Grant Opportunity

The School of Special Education, School Psychology, and Early Childhood Studies in the College of Education at the University of Florida is pleased to announce an exciting new doctoral leadership preparation opportunity for individuals interested in obtaining a Ph.D. in Special Education and expertise in integrating School-wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports and School Mental Health Services using the Interconnected Systems Framework.

Project Integrate is designed to develop and graduate five (5) scholars with unparalleled expertise in (a) School- Wide Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (SWPBIS), (b) School Mental Health (SMH) services and interventions, (c) integration of SWPBIS and SMH using the Interconnected Systems Framework (ISF), (d) skill in rigorous research methodologies to evaluate SWPBIS, SMH, and ISF, and (e) effective teacher education to disseminate those practices.

Project graduates will be well prepared as quantitative researchers who can develop, implement, and disseminate results from diverse experimental research, including single-case design and randomized control trials, aligned with the phases of research supported by the Institute of Education Science's (IES) goal structure (i.e., exploratory, development, efficacy, effectiveness). Graduates will also be prepared to cultivate highly qualified teachers through preservice teacher education programs and evidence-based professional development activities to scale SWPBIS, SMH, and ISF.



INTERESTED?

Project Integrate applications are currently being accepted. Admitted students will begin taking the program in Fall 2020.

To be eligible for Project Integrate, students must meet the following requirements:

1. Be admitted into the special education PhD program,
2. Hold a master's degree in special education or a related field,
3. Enroll as a full-time graduate student,
4. Be a U.S. citizen or a permanent resident, and
5. Adhere to the requirements established by the U.S. Department of Education and implemented by the Personnel Development Program Data collection Center (<https://pdp.ed.gov/osep>).
