

## Teach English to Children in China

I recently graduated from the UF College of Education and I have an amazing job opportunity you might be interested in.

The job is working online in the mornings to teach English to Children in China. The pay is \$16-\$20 an hour and there are travel opportunities too! The company offers employees to go to China for summer camps along with other opportunities to meet the students that we teach!

This job has given me, as an education major, many opportunities to work with diverse populations, teach children, and make money. Hopefully it can do the same for others who have an interest in international studies, teaching, or the Chinese culture.

Below you will find instructions on how to apply for the job along with some more in depth information. Feel free to email me with any questions and if/when someone applies so that I can follow up with the company as well at [mpappy96@gmail.com](mailto:mpappy96@gmail.com)

To begin, you will need to Email [referrals@qkids.net](mailto:referrals@qkids.net) and they will give you all of the information! Make sure to give them my code of LMGCHB when you email so that they know who has helped along the way.

Basically this online position is early in the morning or later in the evening and everything is set up through their software! There are four morning classes from 6:40-9:10 AM EST seven days a week. And on the weekends there are 5 evening classes I believe from 8:00-12:00 or something like that.

You have to teach at least 12 classes a week (6 hours) in order to stay with the company, but if things get crazy there is a little leeway with the schedule.

It's just a 30 minute class with up to 4 kids in the class and everything is provided for you. It's like a fancy interactive powerpoint basically so there is little to no prep that needs to be done. All you need is an education background or experience working with or tutoring children. You'll also need a computer with the right specs (Most Macs work perfectly and many other brands work well too), and a headset!

If you look up QKIDS and find their website there is some information on it, you can also youtube and find some example videos of lessons I believe. Here are some links to help.

I've been working with them on and off since November of 2016, when school gets crazy they let you take some time off to recoup and come back when you're ready. Also, pay is anywhere from \$8-\$10 a session so \$16-\$20 an hour!! It's amazing!

You get paid monthly, typically on the 12th of every month and it just gets directly deposited to your bank account. Or, if you would rather, they can do it through PayPal I believe.

To get hired you will send an application that consists of a resume, a brief description of yourself and your qualifications and a 1-3 minute video of you reading a children's book so that they can see how fluent you are with the English Language.

From there, you will have a demo lesson where a trainer shows you how to use the software and flip through the slides. Then you will teach 3 trial lessons and receive feedback on them. Once you pass those 3 trial lessons they will either ask you to do a few more or they will go right ahead and hire you and have you start working the following week!
