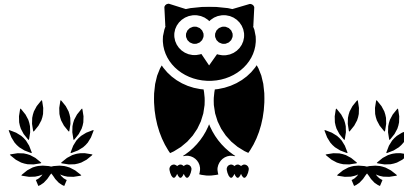


Minorities in Philosophy Undergraduate Conference

Aim of the Conference

The aim of this conference is to encourage minority voices in philosophy, to the end of promoting the scholarship of underrepresented groups, such as women, people of color, members of the LGBTQA+ community, and those with disabilities.

We are looking for papers on any philosophical topic from the perspectives of those belonging to underrepresented groups in philosophy. Alternatively, we encourage topics that highlight minority philosophy or discuss issues of those underrepresented in philosophy; for example, papers in queer theory, feminism, race and philosophy, and disability theory.

Our keynote speaker is Dr. Pete Westmoreland from the University of Florida Philosophy Department, whose talk is entitled “Self-Knowledge and Domination.”

Restrictions and Directions

- ◇ Papers should be from about five to ten pages, double spaced. There will be up to twenty minutes to present, with a ten minute question and answer period.
- ◇ Papers should be written at an undergraduate level.
- ◇ Papers should be prepared for an anonymous review, so your name should appear only in your email, and not on your paper.
- ◇ Note that this is a call for papers, not abstracts.
