WHAT IS PROJECT DECODE?

Project DECODE is a personnel preparation project designed to provide interdisciplinary preparation for school psychology and special education personnel through collaborative activities to develop expertise in reading assessment and intervention generally, and dyslexia specifically. Participating scholars will develop professional collaboration skills for future partnerships when practicing in schools.

WHAT ARE THE REQUIREMENTS FOR PROJECT DECODE?

- Maintain a 3.0 GPA and remain in good standing in the program
- Complete the introductory Dyslexia Certificate course (3 credits)
- Attend Monthly Project Seminars (1-2 hours per month)
- Collaborate with DECODE Special Education Scholars in coordinated course and field experience (2 - 4 hours per month beyond regular course requirements)
- Participate in the department's Research to Practice Symposium at least once while enrolled in the program
- Sign a Service Obligation Agreement that stipulates 2 years of service in school psychology or a related field for every year of funding
